The Million Village Movement

The Mission of the Global CHE Network is to catalyze transformational movements in a million villages. Inspired by hope, and empowered by love and truth, change is moving from village to village and country to country. People are becoming followers of Jesus and whole communities are being lifted out of cycles of poverty and disease.

Global CHE Network

The Global CHE Network - part of the Alliance for Transformational Ministry – is an association of people and organizations using the strategy of Community Health Evangelism (CHE) in villages around the world. Member organizations work collaboratively, strengthening each other's ministries and working together to impact whole nations.

Global CHE Network Representative Council

The Representative Council is made up of mission executives and thought leaders elected by the global membership to give voice to the needs in the field. They preserve CHE values, establish policy, and appoint leaders to represent the Network in each country.

Global CHE Network Service Team

The GCN Service team is made up of self-supporting missionaries, administrative staff, and contractors that serve under the leadership of the Network Coordinator. They provide services and resources that are vital to the strengthening of individual ministries and the expansion of the network.










Vital Services provided to Members by the GCN Service Team

Strengths

- A thoroughly Biblically-based wholistic ministry approach (CHE).
- A 35-year history of demonstrated success in transforming villages, some documented by third-party research studies.
- CHE principles, strategies, and content accepted and used on worldwide platforms like the United Nations, universities, and schools.
- The most extensive library of lesson plan material available to Christian development workers, carefully researched, open-sourced, based on best practices, and translated into 46 different languages.
- A strong, active, and self-supporting Representative Council made up of Representatives elected by the membership.
- 76 GCN Affiliate organizations, several of them large organizations with a strong commitment to collaboration and partnership.
- Tens of thousands of trainers and volunteers, nearly all of them nationals, giving GCN a truly global reach.
- National networks forming globally under the leadership of Network Facilitators living in country.
- Financially self-supporting Service Team with disciplined low overhead that function as the collaborative hub for the network providing vital services and resources to the entire network.

Opportunities

- Eighty-five percent of the world's poorest live in villages. GCN is strategically positioned to address this challenge with a vision to reach a million villages, a breakthrough strategy, and thousands of trainers in 134 countries mobilizing and equipping churches and faith-based organizations for transformational community-based development.
- CHE is being recognized as a complement to Disciple Making Movements (DMM). A group of network movers and shakers are actively pursuing the integration of CHE and DMM, bringing the development sector of the church together with church planters to advance the work of the Gospel among the rural poor.
- Professors from different Christian universities across America are meeting together regularly to incorporate our principles in their MPH and mission programs. This year, they have developed a course for helping church to understand the depth and breadth of medical missions. Their goal is to mainstream Public Health as Mission.
- **The millennial generation can resonate with our wholistic approach to ministry.**




Achievements in 2018


- Hundreds of national ministries made commitments to initiate work, establish models, and catalyze CHE movements in thousands of villages. Million Village Challenge mobilization conferences were held in Burkina Faso, Nigeria, Myanmar, India, Nepal, Kenya, Ethiopia, and the Ivory Coast.
- GCN is partnering with the Sahel Initiative to establish transformational CHE movements among 330 unreached people groups across North Africa. 127 of these groups have no Gospel witness. Forty-eight Chadian missionaries were trained for CHE work in unreached villages in the northern parts of Chad.
- GCN members have initiated training with indigenous workers in Brazil and Peru targeting unreached people deep in the Amazon jungles.
- GCN members have integrated Community Health Evangelism (CHE) with Disciple Making Movements (DMM). Training has begun in several countries on three different continents.
- CHE materials are now available in 46 different languages
- CHE materials have been adapted for use with governments, public schools, and universities.



- The GCN Service Team has provided vital services to more than 1200 members. They provide digital platforms for connection and collaboration, manage curriculum development and distribution, map the CHE movement, coordinated conferences, and manage the marketing of CHE Network activities to the public and to stakeholders.
- GCN members at the United Nations are envisioning governments for transformational movements among the village poor.
- More than 800 people attended our International Wholistic Mission Conferences in Phoenix and Kansas City.
- Unique and innovative programs have been initiated in Vietnam and the Ivory Coast. In Vietnam, drug addicts are being rehabilitated and trained as pastors and CHE workers in 90 different rehab centers. In the Ivory Coast, CHE is being taught in the National University and engaging students establishing CHE programs in villages as part of their coursework.



Budget Allocations 2019



Total Budget: 471,944

- 55% - Self-Raised Missionary / Staff Support
- 11% - Travel for Mobilization, Training, Consultation, and Collaboration
- 11% - Curriculum Development, Website, and Communications
- 7% - HR and Accounting Services
- 7% - CHE Promotions, Member Services, and Fund Raising
- 9% - Administrative Staff, Facilities, Office Supplies, Phone and Internet
